

Sunflower Wreath



You'll Need:

- 1ea- 14" Metal Wreath Form
- 2 rolls – Yellow Mesh
- 2pkgs – Yellow Chenille Stems
- 1pkg – Green Fern
- 5ea – 4" Grapevine Balls
- 1pkg – Small Grapevine Balls
- 1 roll – Rusty Wire

Directions:

1. Cut 21 pieces of 18" mesh. Fold it from the top down, and then fold the top edges inward, making a triangle. Gather the mesh into your hand, making a petal. Tie the mesh onto the wire wreath form on the second ring from the outside with a chenille stem. Once it's secure, trim some of the excess mesh off of the inside. If you don't, you will end up with too much mesh on the back of the wreath. Repeat this process 20 more times, arranging the petals around the wreath form. You should end up with 21 petals on the outer edge.
2. Cut 11 pieces of 18" mesh. Repeat the steps from #1 to make a petal. Tie the petal onto the innermost ring of the wreath form. This time, don't trim any excess mesh. Leave it in the center of the wreath form. Repeat this process 10 more times, arranging the petals around the wreath form. You should end up with 11 petals on the inner edge.
3. Cut 6 pieces of 14" mesh. Repeat the steps from #1 to make a petal. Tie the petal onto the innermost ring in between the other petals. Again, don't trim the excess mesh. There should be 2 bigger petals between each new petal, except for one that will only have 1 petal between them.
4. Hot glue the grapevine balls onto the mesh in the middle of the wreath form. ***Be careful! You don't want to use too much glue or you'll be able to see the glue once it's***

dry. Glue only enough to secure the grapevine balls to the wreath. Run the rusty wire through the grapevine balls to secure them all together. Don't run the wire through the mesh, only the grapevine balls. Stick the fern stems into the mesh on the back of the wreath. Make a hanger with a chenille stem and enjoy your wreath! 😊
