

Watermelon Wreath



You'll Need:

- 2/3yd Burlap
- 1ea – Football Wreath Form
- 1ea – Green Hydrangea Bush
- 4ea – Red Geranium Bush
- 4ea – White Baby's Breath
- 1ea – Watermelon Spray
- 1ea – Foam Sheet
- 3yds – Ribbon for Bow

Directions:

1. Cover the wreath form with the burlap and glue down. Make sure the burlap is fairly tight on the form.
2. Clip the clusters of hydrangea flowers off the bush. Make sure you leave some of the stem on each bunch! You'll poke the stem through the burlap and use that to glue the bunch into place. Do the same for the geranium bush and baby's breath.
3. Now you're ready to start putting the flowers on the burlap. Starting at the bottom of the form, poke holes in the burlap with a nail or awl and insert a hydrangea stem and glue it into place. Make sure that you're starting at the bottom of the wreath form so you won't be able to see any of the burlap underneath. Once all of the hydrangea bunches are glued on, do the same with the baby's breath, and finally the geranium bunches. When working on the geranium bunches, don't cover the very top of the wreath form. When the wreath is hanging, you won't be able to see the burlap on top and you want your watermelon to look somewhat flat on the top.
4. Cut out some seeds from the foam sheet and glue onto the wreath. Glue the watermelon sign onto the wreath and make a bow and glue that on too.
5. You're done! 😊
